2010 Schedule

- **SPRING DIG: April 17th & 18th**, the Saddle Mountain dig is about 20 miles south of Vantage near Mattawa, WA. Camp will be at the Priests Rapids Boat Launch two miles south of Mattawa (West off highway 243) at the Columbia River. Washington Department of Wildlife requires an access permit for camping, which comes with a fishing license or can be obtained for about \$10.00 at any place that sells hunting-fishing licenses. Camping is free. It is a dry camping site, no potable water or electricity. The Pow-Wow Club will furnish porta-potties. The public is invited to attend. Membership is required to participate in the activities. We will be digging for petrified wood, picture wood, limb sections and possibly common opal. Saturday evening at 5 PM a potluck dinner will be served with hot dogs and hamburgers furnished by the Pow-Wow Club. Dinner will be followed by a short general meeting and donated door prizes. Sunday morning at 8 AM a pancake & sausage breakfast is furnished by the Pow-Wow Club (weather permitting). Tailgating and rock swapping is highly encouraged.
- **SUMMER EXTRAVANGANZA: June 30th—July 4th**, the Madras Pow-Wow Gem Mineral Show is at the Jefferson County Fair Grounds in Madras, OR. Camp on a grassy field for a small fee. The grassy field has no hookups but water, showers and toilet facilities are close by. A sewage pumping truck will be available during the event and will pump holding tanks for a fee. The fairgrounds RV Park is adjacent to the event, has full hookups and managed by the fairgrounds. The daily field trips to dig for agate, jasper, thunder eggs and petrified wood are on private ranches. There is a small fee for materials taken. Bring your rock hounding tools. Daily events include a rock toss/scramble for the kids, rock swapping for both kids and adults, free entertainment starting at 7:45 PM nightly with guest speakers, live band, bingo, door prizes or a great auction. Come visit the many dealers with everything from rough rock to finished jewelry and equipment to fill all your lapidary needs.
- **FALL DIG: September 11th & 12th**, the Pow-Wow camps at the American Forest Resources Teanaway Campground (formerly Boise Cascade campground #17). Driving east from Cle Elum, WA on State Road 970 to the Teanaway River Road North (turn left off 970). Drive approximately 7.2 miles, turn left. Drive .7 (tenths) of a mile to the camp ground (on the left). Camping is free. It is a dry camp with out-houses, but no potable water or electricity. The public is invited to attend. Membership is required to participate in the activities. We will dig for agates, crystal nodules, jadeite and possibly Ellensburg Blue. There will be a Saturday evening potluck dinner at 5 PM. Hamburgers and hot dog will be provided by the Pow-Wow Club. Dinner will be followed by the general membership meeting to elect club officers with donated door prizes. Sunday morning at 8 AM is a pancake & sausage breakfast furnished by the Pow-Wow Club (weather permitting). Tailgating and rock swapping is encouraged. Note: some of the parking places at the dig sites require a forest services permit which can be purchased at the trail heads for around \$5.00 a day.
- **Membership Dues:** Membership and current dues are required for all breakfast and field trip participants. Dues are paid for January 1st to December 31st and are payable in U.S. Funds only. The current yearly membership dues are \$7.50 per person or \$15.00 per family (includes 17yrs. and under).
